One Voice advocates on their behalf and supports best practices in nonprofit management. Of the 78 organizations who were surveyed, 85% offer full or partial health insurance to employees and 59% offer retirement benefits to employees.



#### Strength in Numbers

Welcomed 14 new member organizations, increasing the membership to 87 health and human service nonprofits.



#### **Advocating for Social Services**

Led an advocacy campaign to increase funding for social services in the City of Austin FY16 budget, resulting in City Council increasing funding for the Health and Human Services Department by \$2.5 million, undesignated social contracts by \$1.825 million, and various one-time and ongoing contracts for specific Health and Human Services projects.



#### **Raising Awareness**

Launched two installments of the Tale of Two Austins public awareness campaign focused on behavioral health and workforce development disparities in our community, reaching over 250,000 individuals and shared more than 1,500 times.



#### **Taking Care of Our Own**

Formed a Multiple Employer Plan for retirement benefits and established a Benefits Task Force to identify opportunities for the collective purchasing of healthcare and ancillary benefits.



#### **Strengthening Nonprofits**

Provided support and capacity building opportunities for members by partnering with Leadership Austin and held three leadership training sessions for Executive Directors and emerging nonprofit leaders, and engaging over one-fourth of members in peer-to-peer buddy programs.



#### Planning for the Future

Engaged in a strategic planning process and member retreat to identify priorities and a workplan for 2016-2018.



#### **Increasing Financial Support**

Received grants totaling over \$50,000 from the RGK Foundation, St. David's Foundation, and AstraZeneca to support One Voice's programs.
